

Project update on funds raised at the 2019 Presidential Golf Challenge

Cyril Ramaphosa Foundation was nominated as the beneficiary of the 2019 Presidential Golf Challenge. As a partner entity of the Cyril Ramaphosa Foundation, Adopt-a-School Foundation was appointed to implement sanitation projects at four schools in 2019.

Sanitation projects chosen with the funding received from the 2019 Presidential Golf Challenge

Through funds received, new ablution facilities have been constructed at four schools. The four schools include two schools in the Eastern Cape, Mandleni Junior Secondary School and Ixopo Junior Secondary School, Mpucuko Primary School in KwaZulu-Natal and Madikoti Putsoa Primary School in Limpopo. The schools were identified in partnership with the Department of Basic Education, in line with the Sanitation Appropriate for Education (SAFE) initiative. These projects began mid- 2019 and we are excited to report that these project are near completion.

About the Adopt-a-School Foundation

The Adopt-a-School Foundation, officially established in 2002, strives to support the delivery of an enhanced and conducive teaching environments. This is done through the support of public and private partners assisting the Foundation to implement its replicable model of Whole School Development. The model focuses on the development of four critical areas within a school environment; leadership, curriculum, infrastructural, social and learner-wellbeing in adopted schools. The public and private partners include a wide range of stakeholders; such as corporates, individuals, best practice NGOs and the Department of Basic Education from District to National levels.

Adopt-a-School Foundation's Community-based Infrastructure Model

Adopt-a-School Foundation is driven to uplift not only the schools, but the communities in which those schools are located. Skilled and unskilled parents from the community are supported through temporary employment opportunities in the construction of the facilities. This helps to improve the sustainability of school development and the success of implemented projects. These personnel are sourced with the help of a Project Steering Committee (PSC), comprised of volunteers from the School Governing Body and School Manage Team, in partnership with the Foundations' Project Manager.

The infrastructure model provides temporary employment for the workers, empowers them with a set of skills and experience that improves their employability. Through the 2019 PGC projects the Foundation afforded temporary employment opportunity to 115 workers.

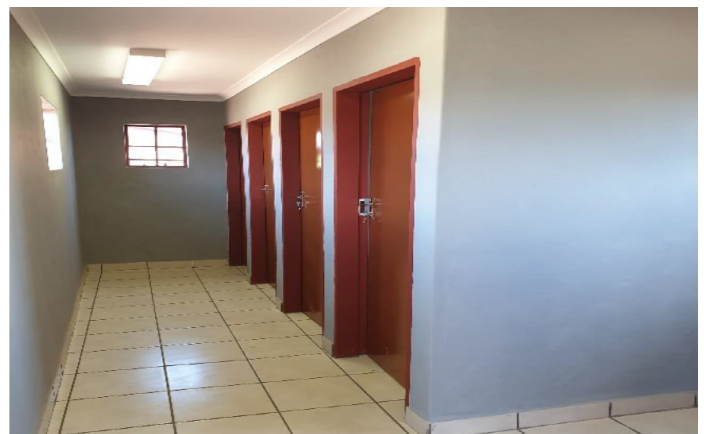

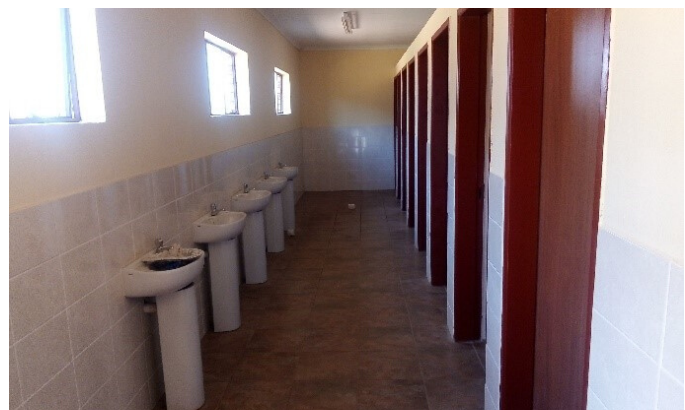
