Project update on funds raised at the 2020 Presidential Golf Challenge

Cyril Ramaphosa Foundation was nominated as the beneficiary of the 2020 Presidential Golf Challenge. It appointed its Whole School Development partner entity, Adopt-a-School Foundation, to implement sanitation projects at three designated schools in 2020. These schools are Bodutlulo Primary School in Malipsdrift village in Limpopo, Tlouatiba Primary School in Mathabatha village in Limpopo, and Nongamlana Secondary in Nkandla in KwaZulu-Natal.

This is done with the support of public and private partners that assist the Foundation to implement its replicable model of Whole School Development (WSD). The model focuses on the development of four critical areas within a school environment: leadership, curriculum, infrastructural and social and learner well-being in adopted schools. The public and private partners include a wide range of stakeholders, such as corporates, individuals, best practice NGOs and the Department of Basic Education from district to national levels. The Adopt-a-School Foundation celebrates its 20^{th} anniversary this year.



Adopt-a-School's Vision and Impact

Adopt-a-School's vision is to contribute to the building of dynamic, transformed, and accessible schooling environments that produce capable global citizens to meet the developmental needs of southern Africa. AAS Foundation's goals are as follows:

- ensure delivery of quality and best value programmes for beneficiaries and stakeholders;
- ensure effective programme implementation to support the improvement of learning outcomes in schools;
- establish and maintain a reputable, capable, innovative and dynamic organisation;
- develop and maintain systems and policies to support transparency, accountability and good governance;
- develop and maintain funding models that will ensure the long- term sustainability and optimal impact of AAS's work.

Adopt-a-School Foundation's community-based infrastructure model

Adopt-a-School Foundation is driven to uplift not only the schools, but the communities in which those schools are located. Skilled and unskilled parents from the community are supported through temporary employment opportunities in the construction of the facilities. This helps to improve the sustainability of school development and the success of implemented projects. These personnel are sourced with the help of a Project Steering Committee (PSC), comprised of volunteers from the School Governing Body and School Management Team, in partnership with the Foundations' Project Manager. The infrastructure model provides temporary employment for the workers and empowers them with a set of skills and experience that improves their employability. Through the 2020 PGC projects the Foundation afforded temporary employment opportunity to 42 workers.
